Sir

St. Louis April 27th 1820

By the last mail I received a letter from the Secretary of War covering an extract of your letter to him of the 15th of Feb. y and the inclosed Invoice of Annuities due the Quapaws for 1819 - Four tiers marked agreeably to the Invoice have been received into the public Store at this place, and ^{two} other tiers marked 'U S F Arkansas No 2' which have been sent on to this place I presume in mistake; Those tiers shall be forwarded in the first steam boat which descends from this place to New Orleans, to be left in Store at the mouth of Arkansas River subject to your order. This is the only mode of conveyance to be met with at this place.
