Dear Mr. Luguet:

This will acknowledge receipt of your letter of February 18.

Mr. E. B. Whitaker, Pyramid Building, Little Rock, is the State Director of the War Relocation Centers. He and the officials in charge of the Relocation Centers have complete jurisdiction over the Japanese in this State. I suggest that you contact Mr. Whitaker as I have absolutely no authority in these matters and my position has been that these people should be kept on the Reservation for their own protection, however, as before stated, it is a matter entirely in the hands of Mr. Whitaker and his associates.
