I know all men by their presents that we Paym^t to
Peterson as principal and Grantler N. Taylor, as Deputy
are held and firmly bound unto the County Treasurer
of the County of Lawrence in Arkansas Territory
for the true doing, and discharge in Office in the
sum of ten of one hundred Dollars, which Payment
well and truly to be made or since ordered, our true
administrators and assigns, jointly by their presents, do
witness our hands and seals this 11th day of July 1831

The Condition of the above obligation is that
that whereas the County Court of Lawrence County in
Arkansas Territory did on the 5th day of July 1831
1831 at the July Term hereby grant unto the same
between Peyton Robinson, a Slave to keep a ferry
on, one acre Current Water at his residence for the
sum of one year from the date aforesaid; Now
therefore if the said Peyton Robinson, shall well
and truly do and perform all and singular the duties
of ferry-man according to Law, and the form of
the Statute in such cases made and provided, then this
obligation to be void and of none effect otherwise
to remain in full force and Virtue in Law
