A Draft of a house to be built  
By A. C. Childers as Executor of the  
Estate John Wells Deceased as follows  
to wit, the said house is to be 18  
By 20 feet, One Story high and  
the Logs are to be hewn, the Roof  
is to be put on with Rafters and  
Covered with 3 feet Boards only and  
third of the Board to show, the floor  
is to be laid with good Planks and  
put Down in workman like manner  
and said house to be sealed over  
head, and to make 3 good doors  
with shutters, to be done in workman  
Order, one window to be made of  
Common size with good Sashes  
and lights, also one Stone Chimney  
and the undertaker is to furnish all  
the materials and to paint the house  
and finished off the house to be ready  
for Living in, <sup>by the first of october next</sup> and the receipt is  
not to be received by the executor un  
less the work is all done in good  
workman like order and if the under  
taker should fail, in any particu  
lar, he shall forfeit all the work  
he should have done on said  
House, the above materials to  
be of good sound plank and well seasoned  
this 12<sup>th</sup> July 1860
