That we, M. J. Middle J. G. Perry Richard Coons and

~~as sureties~~, acknowledge ourselves jointly and severally to owe and be indebted unto the
United States of America, in the sum of Two Hundred & fifty
dollars, to be levied of our goods and chattels, lands
and tenements, to the use of the said United States, if default shall be made in the condition
following, to-wit :

Whereas, the said Jesse Woodell
Edward J. Correll
has been brought before JAMES O. CHURCHILL, a United States Commissioner for the
Western District of Arkansas, to answer to the charge of Larceny.

and upon an examination had, it appearing to said Commissioner that the offence with which
the said Jesse Woodell
was charged had
been committed, and that there was probable cause to believe the said Jesse
Woodell
to be guilty thereof, the Commissioner thereupon ordered
~~M. J. Middle J. G. Perry R. Coons & Bill Frank~~ to find sufficient bail in
the sum of Two Hundred & fifty ~~each~~ each dollars for them
appearance at a District Court of the United States for the Western District of Arkansas, to
be holden on the 9th day of May A. D. 1870, at the
U. S. Court Room in the city of Van Buren, in said District, to answer to said cause
~~all such matters and things as shall be objected against~~ there be objected against him; and that in default of finding such bail they stand
committed for trial.

Now, Therefore, the Condition of this Recognizance is such, That
if the said M. J. Middle J. G. Perry R. Coons & Bill Frank shall personally appear at the
said Court on the first day of the next May Term thereof, at the U.
S. Court Room in the City of Van Buren, at 10 o'clock, A. M., and then and there answer
said cause ~~and there answer~~ to said cause ~~all such matters and things as shall be objected against~~ there be objected against
and abide the orders
of the Court, and not depart the said Court without leave, then this Recognizance to be
void, otherwise to be in full force and virtue.
