United States of America, in the sum of *Five Hundred*

dollars, to be levied of our goods and chattels, lands
and tenements, to the use of the said United States, if default shall be made in the condition
following, to-wit :

Whereas, ~~the said~~ *George W. Walker*
has been brought before **JAMES O. CHURCHILL**, a United States Commissioner for the
Western District of Arkansas, to answer to the charge of *giving* ~~giving~~ *Sp*

Liquor to Indians
and upon an examination had, it appearing to said Commissioner that the offence with which
the said *Geo W Walker* was charged had
been committed, and that there was probable cause to believe the said

Geo W Walker to be guilty thereof, the Commissioner thereupon ordered
said *Nancy J Lemay* to find sufficient bail in
the sum of *Five Hundred* dollars for *her*
appearance at a District Court of the United States for the Western District of Arkansas, to
be holden on the *9th* day of *May* A. D. 1870, at the
U. S. Court Room in the city of Van Buren, in said District, to ~~answer what may then~~ ^{*answer*} and
~~there be objected against him~~ ^{*care*}; and that in default of finding such bail stand
committed for trial.

Now, Therefore, the Condition of this Recognizance is such, That
if the said *Nancy J Lemay* shall personally appear at the
said Court on the first day of the next *May* Term thereof, at the U.
S. Court Room in the City of Van Buren, at 10 o'clock, A. M., and then and there ~~answer~~
~~all such matters and things as shall be objected against~~ ^{*answer in said Court*} and abide the orders
of the Court, and not depart the said Court without leave, then this Recognizance to be
void, otherwise to be in full force and virtue.
