LITTLE ROCK, ARK., March 8th, 1865.

1. 1st Lieutenant Austin Rawlings, company "B," 1st Missouri Cavalry Volunteers, is appointed ambulance officer of the Cavalry Division, 7th Army Corps, and will relieve 1st Lieutenant W. J. Buchanan, 3rd Michigan Cavalry Volunteers, without delay. On being relieved, Lieutenant Buchanan will report to these Headquarters for orders.

2. The Quartermasters' Department will furnish transportation to St. Louis, Missouri, for the following named enlisted men, whose term of service expired November — 1864, but were prisoners of war, in the hands of the enemy, at that time:

Corporal William S. Vader, company "D," 7th Missouri Cavalry Volunteers.

Private Frederick C. Bush, company "D," 7th Missouri Cavalry Volunteers.

He will report to Captain E. S. Redington, 28th Wisconsin Infantry Volunteers, at Little Rock, without delay.
