Statute as amended and John Black & Isaac Pat-
and Thomas Black Securities are here and are
firmly to come into John White Governor of the Territory of
Arkansas and his Successors in office in the several
sum of Two Hundred Dollars - Money of the United States
to be paid to the said John White Governor - as specified
and his Successors in office - to their Payment
Well and truly to be paid the said Securities are being
Executors and Administrators, firmly by their present
Deeds with our seals at the Town of Jackson -
this first day of October in the year of
our Lord Eighteen hundred and thirty -

John White
Governor

The Conditions of the above obligations
is such that whereas the said Statute has been
apportioned between certain and for the County of
Lawrence - Now if the aforesaid Charles Statute shall
Well and truly do and perform all Matters and Things
required by the said of the Territory respecting said
Securities and do perform all said specified things
which he may be ordered to do by the said Governor
or Governor to come for in case of his incompetency and
in case of his death by Law or Appointment -
then ~~and~~ the obligations to be made
shall remain to remain in full force and
Virtue according to the same in full force and
Virtue
