My Gov^r Ball having requested us to
 state such information as we possess in
 relation to the conduct of John Williams
 a Justice of the Peace of Warren County
 Township in Clark County - we regret
 to say that his conduct as a Magistrate is
 the subject of much complaint in his
 County & we believe that he has
 not discharged the duties appertaining
 to his Office with a proper regard to the
 obligations imposed on him by law -
 his conduct relative to a number
 of small suits against My^r Ball
 tried before him was very improper
 manifesting a determination to use his
 powers as Magistrate to harass and
 injure his property
 several suits
