Malaria control:

Have ask the health committee to take this matter up immediately. At present there is only 7 men and this number is not sufficient so are trying to increase the number. Attention is brought to watch the garbage.

TEEN-AGE CANTEN:

The teen-age canteen needs two chaperone to be able to open up. The regulation states that it cannot be open unless there is two chaperone to watch the canteen. This is a position with pay and those interested see C. A. There is a complain from the block-19, that boys and girls catering the canteen loiters around the place after closing and make lot of noise.

Welfare Section:

The resettlement committee is translating the new regulation in regards to welfare benefits put out by Washington and expects to be ready for distribution to the public about the 18th.
