Know all Men by these Presents:

That we, *A Harlan Henderson Walker and David McCurtain* as principal, and as sureties, acknowledge ourselves jointly and severally to owe and be indebted unto the United States of America, in the sum of *Five Hundred* dollars, to be levied of our goods and chattels, lands and tenements, to the use of the said United States, if default shall be made in the condition following, to-wit:

Whereas, the said *Alex Walker* has been brought before JAMES O. CHURCHILL, a United States Commissioner for the Western District of Arkansas, to answer to the charge of

Larceny in the Indian Country and upon examination had, it appearing to said Commissioner that the offence with which he was charged had been committed, and that there was probable cause to believe *him* guilty thereof, the Commissioner ordered said *A. Harlan, Henderson Walker and David McCurtain*

to find sufficient bail in the sum of *Five Hundred* dollars for *their* appearance at a District Court of the United States for the Western District of Arkansas, to be holden on the *5th* day of *May* A. D. 187*1* of the U. S. Court Room in the city of Van Buren, in said District, to *answer in said case* ~~answer what may~~ *arise in* ~~them~~ and there be objected against ; and that in default of finding such bail stand ~~committed for trial.~~

Now, Therefore, The condition of this Recognizance is such, that if the said *A. Harlan Henderson Walker and David McCurtain* shall personally appear at the said Court on the first day of the next *May* Term thereof, at the U. S. Court Room in the city of Van Buren, at 10 o'clock A. M., and then and there *answer in said case* ~~answer~~ all such matters and things as shall be objected against and abide the orders of the Court, and not depart the said Court without leave, then this Recognizance to be void, otherwise to be in full force and virtue.
