Know all Men by these Presents:

That we, Ta-ka-tub-bee & Stand Collins
as principal, and
as sureties, acknowledge ourselves jointly and severally to owe and be indebted unto the United States of America, in the sum of Two Hundred & fifty dollars, to be levied on our goods and chattels, lands and tenements, to the use of the said United States, if default shall be made in the condition following, to-wit:

Whereas, ~~the said~~ John Williams
has been brought before EDWARD J. BROOKS, a United States Commissioner for the Western District of Arkansas, to answer to the charge of Larceny in

the Indian Country,
and upon examination had, it appearing to said Commissioner that the offence with which he was charged had been committed, and that there was probable cause to believe his guilty thereof, the Commissioner ordered said Ta-ka-tub-bee & Stand Collins

to find sufficient bail in the sum of Two Hundred & fifty dollars for ^{such} ~~their~~ appearance at a District Court of the United States for the Western District of Arkansas, to be holden on the 8 day of May A. D. 1877 at the U. S. Court Room in the city of Van Buren, in said District, to ~~answer~~ testify in said ~~and there be objected against~~ him; and that in default of finding such bail they stand committed ~~to jail~~.

Now, Therefore, The condition of this Recognizance is such, that if the said Ta-ka-tub-bee & Stand Collins shall personally appear at the said Court on the first day of the next May Term thereof, at the U. S. Court Room in the city of Van Buren, at 10 o'clock A. M., and then and there ~~answer~~ testify ~~and there be objected against~~ in said cause and abide the orders of the Court, and not depart the said Court without leave, then this Recognizance to be void, otherwise to be in full force and virtue.
