1—All officers and soldiers are to be taken up on the rolls, so soon as assigned to the company by competent authority, whether they have yet joined, or not; and to be dropped, when actually transferred from it.
 2—Under the head of REMARKS, the date when any assignment takes effect, the No. date, &c., of order therefor; the date of any officer or soldier's leaving, whether regularly, or from any absence; the date of an officer's resignation, or being relieved, from any command; or special duty; the description of any special, extra, or daily duty on which officers or soldiers may be; all changes of rank, by promotion, or otherwise; by transfer, with date of same, and No. date, &c., of order; all detached companies, from whatever, with No. date, &c., of order, &c., in case of absence, the nature and amount of pay, and amount of No. date, &c., of order, and period, assigned for same (to be reported on every roll while it lasts); if awarded in battle, or upon an expedition, or confined a prisoner in this effect, &c., &c., to the soldier, and to the Government, and to the name of the person concerned; and anything else in writing, relative to every individual of the company—to guide the paymaster—or more justice.
 3—In making returns to be reported for loss or damage to public property, the gross amount due for Ordnance, for Horse equipment, for Clothing, &c., will be separately stated.

NOTE 1.—The list of those belonging to the Company shall be immediately followed by that of the officers, and so down since in a muster, according to being to it.
