Sir after my best respects to you I will say that if I am bound to exercise in the Militia duty, you are bound to furnish me with the Militia laws of this Territory when a man wants to be guided by the law he wants to know what the law is —

I named in a return that I made of my muster in October last that I wanted to be furnished with twelve copies of the Militia laws but was not heard —

I see orders in the papers for electing a Major in the Clark County Battalion it is a mistake it is a Colonel that is wanted I have not using my Commission Yours
