Rondo Askd Feb 23rd, 1864

Gov H Hamagin

Dear Sir

A party of seven men came to Mr Sniggs about dark on yesterday, helped themselves to four horses and fifteen thousand dollars. This news reached me at noon to day, and in consequence of the delay and the small force that is with me I deemed it impracticable to hunt them. It would be for the public good, to have fifty or sixty men in this Co to enforce the conscript law and to dispose of the men that are laying out and others who are said to owe allegiance to the ~~Great~~ Gov. In consequence of the grog shops that are in this place quite a number of suspicious looking men are here at times, and in order to find out who and what they are I would like to have twelve men in addition to what I have, so as to form a police or Guard. I am limited in instruction and therefore feel at a loss as to my duty.
