## **Biographical/Historical Note**

---

Related through marriage, the White, Wilson, and Miller families were farmers who settled in Tennessee, Kentucky, Missouri, Arkansas, Indian Territory, and Texas between the years 1841-1930. Despite living in the South, the White and Miller families largely fought for the Union during the Civil War.

George W. Wilson married T.J. Miller in 1894. Wilson served in the Second Arkansas Infantry during the Spanish-American War, enrolling on May 13, 1898. The Second Arkansas Infantry saw no combat and remained in camp in Georgia and then Alabama for the duration of the war. Wilson was honorably discharged on November 17, 1898.
