\$200,000 Suit Goes To Trial Here

A suit for approximately \$200,000 allegedly due F. A. Mote by the A. J. Rife Construction Co. and Associates from profits realized in the construction of the Jerome Relocation Center went to trial in Chancery Court here Tuesday afternoon.

The case will probably continue through this week. The plaintiff alleges the amount is due him as a partner in the construction work.
