KNOW ALL MEN BY THESE PRESENTS:

That we W. N. Coors

as Principal, and

as Sureties, acknowledge ourselves jointly and severally to owe and be indebted unto the United States of America, in the sum of Two Hundred & fifty Dollars, to be levied of our goods and chattels, lands and tenements, to the use of the said United States, if default shall be made in the condition following, to-wit:

Whereas, The said Sarah Wilson has been brought before EDWARD J. BROOKS, a United States Commissioner for the Western District of Arkansas, to answer to the charge of Retail Liquor dealer without paying special tax

and upon examination had, it appearing to said Commissioner that the offence with which she was charged had been committed, and that there was probable cause to believe her guilty thereof, the said Commissioner ordered said Witness to find sufficient bail in the sum of Two Hundred & fifty Dollars for his appearance at a District court of the United States for the Western District of Arkansas, to be holden on the 11 day of November, A. D. 1872, at the U. S. Court room in the city of Fort Smith, in said district, to testify in said cause answer what may then and there be objected against, and that in default of finding such bail he stand committed ~~for trial~~.

Now, Therefore, The condition of this Recognizance is such, that if the said

W. N. Coors shall personally appear at the said court on the first day of the next Term thereof, at the U. S. Court room in the city of Fort Smith, at 10 o'clock A. M., and then and there testify in said cause and abide the orders of the Court, and not depart the said Court without leave, then this recognizance to be void, otherwise to be in full force and virtue.
