Directors Of Ass'n. of Commerce Hold Meeting

The regular monthly meeting of Association of Commerce Directors was held Tuesday afternoon at the Association offices. The proposed Jap center for De-sha County was the most important topic for discussion.

The Secretary and Treasurer's reports showed the association in excellent condition financially and membership expanding. The Treasurer's report showed membership dues collected in the month of May \$627.00 and total expenditures for the month of May \$142.67.

The Board adopted a resolution opposing the \$210,000.00 appropriation asked for by Leon Henderson to finance a huge price control force. The Board thought that such huge sums of money could be better spent in the war effort and instructed the Secretary to write Congressmen and Senators urging they vote against the bill. Copies of the letter will be sent other Chambers of Commerce in the State.
