8,059 Japanese Are At Rohwer

No More Scheduled Now For This Center

A total of 8,059 Japanese evacuees are now housed in the Relocation Center at Rohwer near McGehee, according to WRA officials.

A train load of evacuees reached the colony Tuesday, completing all transfers at present scheduled for this place. However, transfers are continuing to the Jerome Relocation Center.

Construction of buildings is still underway at both centers, with the Rohwer project nearer completion. While there is much still to be done, officials said that facilities are ample to take care of the evacuees in comfortable style.

Most of the Japanese appear to be taking their 'protective custody' by the government with good spirits, and are showing a willingness to co-operate with those in charge.

According to one official, the Japanese, especially the children, are buying a considerable amount of War Savings Stamps and Bonds.
