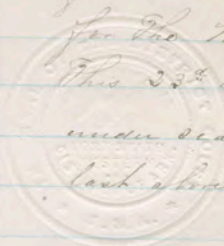

You are hereby commanded
etc. that the body of William C. McCann, in your
custody detained, as it is said, together with
the day and cause of his capture and detention,
by what ever name the said William C. McCann
may be known or called, you shall send before
The Hon. William Story, United States District
Judge for the Western District of Arkansas

at the U.S. Court rooms at Fort Smith in said District
on the 23rd day of January A.D. 1874, at
2 o'clock in the afternoon to do, and to
receive all and singular, those things which the
said William Story Judge as aforesaid, shall
then and there consider of him in this behalf and
have you there and there this writ.

This 23rd day of January, A.D. 1874. Sealed
under seal of said Court the day and year
last above mentioned.
