That we, Doek Williams
as Principal, and Sophia Williams, John F. Lyons, and W.C. Jones
as sureties, acknowledge ourselves jointly and severally to owe and be indebted unto
the United States of America, in the sum of Four Hundred
dollars, to be levied of our goods and chattels, lands and tenements, to the use of the
said United States, if default shall be made in the condition following, to-wit:

WHEREAS,

Doek Williams
has been brought before FLOYD C. BABCOCK, a United States Commissioner for the
Western District of Arkansas, to answer to the charge of Forgery

and upon examination had, it appearing to said Commissioner that the offense with
which he was charged had been committed, and that there was probable cause to
believe him guilty thereof, the said Commissioner ordered said ~~witnesses~~

four to find sufficient bail in the sum of Four
Hundred dollars for his appearance at a District court
of the United States for the Western District of Arkansas, to be holden on the 20th
day of May, A. D. 1874, at the U. S. Court room in the city of
Fort Smith, in said district, to testify in said cause, and that in default of finding
such bail he stand committed.

NOW, THEREFORE, The condition of this Recognizance is such, that if the said
~~witnesses~~ Doek Williams

shall personally appear at the said court on the 20th day of the next May
term thereof, at the U. S. Court room in the city of Fort Smith, at 10 o'clock A. M., and
then and there testify in said cause, and abide the orders of the Court, and not de-
part the said Court without leave, then this recognizance to be void, otherwise to be in
full force and virtue.
