Will you please inform me whether your records show that Gen A. W. Bishop was appointed Register in Bankruptcy in the Western District of Ark or if no such appointment was ever made whether there was any order made by Judge Henry Whelshy Bankrupt Cases were referred out by the Court to Gen Bishop at this place, as you know Bankrupt Cases arising in the Courts of the Western District have been acted on by Gen Bishop in this District. Which I presume must have been done in pursuance of some other legal effect and I seek information as to the precise nature of the case very respectfully
