Sir I have this day received a letter from Senator Bollard of Arkansas, advising me to apply to you for information connects with the said letter in your State & which it is in the power of the State to donate, I wish to get a track so or as near the Mississippi River as possible and will be very much obliged to you if you will let me hear from you as soon as possible - It is my wish to move early next fall & consequently to be informed early of the locality - which you may think most desirable that no time may be lost in preparing for the journey & writes to you some months since, but fearing that the letter was not properly directed I determined before writing again to consult the Hon Mr Bollard
