Historical Note:

The National Socialist German Workers' Party, more commonly known as the Nazi Party, was far-right political party that was active in Germany from the 1920s to 1945 at the end of World War II. By the 1930s, the Nazi Party had taken control of Germany in a totalitarian regime known as the Third Reich. On September 1, 1939, Nazi Germany invaded Poland, sparking World War II, with countries divided along two military alliances of the Axis and the Allied powers. The Axis powers included Germany, Japan, and Italy. The Allies powers were comprised of the United Kingdom, France, Russia (then Soviet Union), China, and the United States. With the defeat of Nazi Germany and the Axis powers at the close of the war in 1945, the Nazi Party was declared an illegal political party. Nazi ideology, insignia, propaganda, and other remnants of the Third Reich were removed during denazification, a program established by the United Nations after the war.

Scope and Contents:

This collection is comprised of a World War II-era Nazi photo album and a newspaper clipping of the American private who found it during his service in the war.
