## Nineteen Pressmen Visit Rohwer Camp

Nineteen newspapermen from Louisiana, Tennessee, Missouri and Arkansas were guests of the War Relocation Authority at Rohwer last Wednesday and Thursday.

The members of the press visited the Center farm, hospital, administration buildings, mess halls, schools, warehouses, construction and resident blocks. A brief talent show was given Thursday afternoon in one of the YWCA rooms.

Newspapers represented were the Arkansas Gazette, Arkansas Democrat, Shreveport Times, Shreveport Journal, Commercial Appeal, Helena World, St. Louis Globe Democrat, Monroe World Star News, United Press and Associated Press. Radio representatives were present from KFAA, Helena and KOTN, Pine Bluff.
