Disloyal Japanese Will Leave Rohwer Camp September 21

The first trainload of Japanese segregatees to transfer from the Rohwer Relocation camp to the Tule Lake segregation center in southern California will leave on September 21, depending upon transportation facilities, War Relocation Authority officials said last week.

The Army will be in charge of the movement from the time the train leaves Rohwer until it arrives in California. One member of the appointed personnel will accompany each contingent in liaison capacity.

Expatriates and repatriates who signed their papers and did not cancel them before July 1 will be sent in the first group, while those who signed their papers after July 1 will be sent to Tule Lake where a hearing will be given before they are allowed to return to the Rohwer center.

Immediate members of a family of a repatriate who applied for repatriation will be interviewed individually by the social welfare department and they will be allowed to stay at their original center or accompany the repatriate.

Transfers from the Tule Lake Center to the Rohwer camp are not expected to number over 1000.

A pamphlet, giving the details of segregation and compiled by the WRA officials, will be distributed to the evacuees.
