country, from Oct 12<sup>th</sup> to Oct 31<sup>st</sup>, 1874, both days inclusive, at the rate of \$2,00 per diem, 20 00

and actual expenses of subsistence while en route, 22 50

U. S. Deputy, for the Western Dist of Arkansas  
do solemnly swear that the foregoing accounts  
is correct and just, that the charges for  
actual expenses are reasonable, that I kept no  
Memoranda of expenditures of money in detail  
the instructions striking out "Mileage" and  
substituting actual expenses instead. having been  
received at the Marshal's Office during my  
absence, but that the total of actual expenses  
charged amounts to the total of the sum  
expended by me in the Prison, Guard and  
my actual traveling expenses, and hire of horse  
during my trips, that the charge for  
transportation, is at the rate of 20¢ per day  
for Prisoner, and 2.25 per day for subsistence  
for myself, and horse and one dollar per  
day for the hire of same, which is as low  
as the transportation, subsistence, feed of horses  
and hire of same, could be had. That the  
charge for hire of guard is made in  
accordance with instructions contained in  
Circular from the Treasury Dept, and the  
subsistence is the same as charged for Prisoner.

And I further swear that the sole and  
charge for in the incho account was  
delivered and actually employed by me and my  
Deputy in endeavoring to arrest, and in returning  
into the Prisoner to St. Francis,
