Sir:

In the case of Thomas booney dec^d, I have the honor to inform you, that before a bounty land warrant can issue to his children, they must produce the certificate of a Court of record, having probate jurisdiction, or of a Magistrate, founded on the testimony of two credible witnesses, certified to be such by said Magistrate, whose official character and genuine signature must be certified by the clerk of a court of record, under his seal of office, setting forth that they, (naming them) are the only surviving children of the deceased soldier, and that he left no widow surviving him. Printed instructions are herewith enclosed.
