Yellville Oct 7th 1849

Genl. A. Wood

Sir

Agreeable to your orders of October the 3rd I proceeded to Conway County. On arriving there I opened the sealed orders, and learnt that Little Tom King had left the state of Arkansas and had gone to the state of Missouri at a place called the Old Lead Mine, I then found Horace and James King, who was on their way to Yellville, ~~with~~ a few miles from Home in Conway County in company with 21 Citizens well armed of Conway County the most of them was the men that helped arrest Loamus G. King when the Emitts took him and on the account of the outrage of killing said King was guarding Horace and James King to Yellville as witness against J. P. Emitt & others
