# ROHWER CENTER TEAM WINS NATIONAL VOLLEYBALL MEET

## Skills Championship Captured by Nisei Junior Girls Group

Dr. George J. Fisher, president of the United States Volleyball Association, announced individual and team results on the 1945 National Volleyball Skills Tournament last night from his New York office. This year's tournament, conducted for the second year during the war period when travel restrictions make the usual tournaments difficult, included boys and women, boys and girls in five different divisions, from the ages of nine years up

The Girls' Junior division title was won for the second consecutive year by the Rohwer Relocation Center in McClehee, Arkansas, with 1078 1/2 points which was not as good as their 1082 1/2 of the previous year. The individual winner was Mitsuyo Ohara who accounted for 320 1/2 of her team total. Last year's winner scored 303 points.

There were 67 participants in the girls' junior division, as compared to the 13 last year. Members of the winning team were Mitsuyo Ohara, Grace Onotau, Yachiko Sumino, Ite Kinoko Nakano, and Teruko Shikawa.
