March 28th 1830

Dear Sir

Permit me to address a few lines
to your Excellency in regard to migration to
your State (Arkansas) there is some 10 indi-
vidual of us citizens of Cumberland County
Penn^a who are desirous of removing to your
State ~~as~~ far to make it our home &
We have been informed that the state gives
a bonus of land to settlers who permanently
settle in your State &
Please state the fact of the case ~~if~~
how much land is given if any is given
at all &

and oblige your friends in Pennsylvania
