Washington D.C. 26 Feb 1852

His Excellency,  
The Governor of Arkansas.

Sir:

I have the  
honour to apply for the Appointment  
of Commissioner of Deeds for the  
State of Arkansas, to reside at  
Washington, Dist of Columbia.

I hold the appointment  
from most of the States of the Union,  
and it is found to be a matter  
of great convenience to strangers  
visiting the Metropolis to have one  
person holding these Commissions  
from the several States.

If agreeable to the Governor  
of Arkansas, it will give me  
great pleasure to receive the  
Commission from his State.
