KNOW ALL MEN BY THESE PRESENTS:

That Thomas Vutton
~~as Principal and~~
~~as sureties, acknowledge ourselves jointly and severally~~ myself to owe and be indebted unto the United States of America, in the sum of Three Hundred dollars, to be levied of ~~our~~ my goods and chattels, lands and tenements, to the use of the said United States, if default shall be made in the condition following, to wit:

WHEREAS, ~~John Vicket~~ John Vicket

has been brought before James O. Churchill a Commissioner for the District Court of the United States for the Western District of Arkansas, to answer to the charge of Larceny in the Indian Country

and upon examination had, it appearing to said Commissioner that the offence with which he was charged had been committed, and that there was probable cause to believe him guilty thereof, the said Commissioner ordered said Thomas Vutton to find sufficient bail in the sum of Three Hundred dollars, for his appearance at a District Court of the United States for the Western District of Arkansas, to be holden on the 13th day of May A. D. 1875, at the U. S. Court room at Fort Smith, in said District, to testify in said cause ~~and~~ answer what may then and there be objected against him and that in default of finding such bail ~~he~~ he stand committed for trial.

NOW THEREFORE, The condition of this Recognizance is such, that if the said Thomas Vutton shall personally appear at the U. S. Court room, at Fort Smith, in said District, at 10 o'clock, A. M. on the fifth day of the next May term thereof, and from day to day during said term, and from term to term thereafter, until discharged by order of said Court, then and there testify in said case ~~and~~ answer what may be objected against him and abide the orders of the Court, and not depart said Court without leave, then this recognizance to be void, otherwise to be in full force and virtue.
