KNOW ALL MEN BY THESE PRESENTS:

That ~~James M. Webb~~ ~~John Webb~~
~~as Principal, and~~ ~~myself~~
~~as sureties, acknowledge ourselves jointly and severally~~ to owe and be indebted unto the United States of America, in the sum of Three Hundred dollars, to be levied of our goods and chattels, lands and tenements, to the use of the said United States, if default shall be made in the condition following, to wit:

WHEREAS, ~~the~~ Frank Wilson Richard Webb and John Stovall

has been brought before James O. Churchill a Commissioner for the District Court of the United States for the Western District of Arkansas, to answer to the charge of Larceny in the Indian Country

and upon examination had, it appearing to said Commissioner that the offence with which they were charged had been committed, and that there was probable cause to believe them guilty thereof, the said Commissioner ~~ordered~~ ordered said James M. Webb ~~John Webb~~ to find sufficient bail in the sum of Three Hundred dollars, for their appearance at a District Court of the United States for the Western District of Arkansas, to be holden on the 10th day of May A. D. 1875, at the U. S. Court room at Fort Smith, in said District, to testify in said cause ~~what may then and there be objected against~~ they stand committed for trial.

NOW THEREFORE, The condition of this Recognizance is such, that if the said James M. Webb ~~John Webb~~ shall, personally appear at the U. S. Court room, at Fort Smith, in said District, at 10 o'clock, A. M. on the first day of the next May term thereof, and from day to day during said term, and from term to term thereafter, until discharged by order of said Court, then and there to testify in said cause ~~and abide the orders of the Court, and not depart said Court without leave, then this recognizance to be void, otherwise to be in full force and virtue.~~
