Biographical/Historical Note

Alexander A. Johnson was born about 1844 in what is now Calhoun County, Alabama, the son of Thomas and Carolina Johnson. At the beginning of the Civil War, Johnson and his family lived at Morrisville, Alabama. During the war, Johnson served in Company E (or F) of the Fifty-Eighth Alabama Infantry. According to family tradition, Johnson was captured and died in a Union prison camp in Illinois during the war.

Scope and Contents

This collection consists of Civil War correspondence plus a journal and other items. The correspondence relates to locations in Tennessee and Georgia, and most were written from the battlefield. It is unknown who created the 1865-1879 journal.
