Biographical/Historical Note

John C. Barrow (1836-1919) lawyer, prosecuting attorney, and politician, practiced law at Hampton, Calhoun County, Arkansas, before the Civil War. During the war he served in Company A, Fourth Arkansas Infantry, Confederate States Army. He participated in the battles of Pea Ridge and Chickamauga, and was taken prisoner at Franklin, Tennessee. After the war, he married and moved to Monticello, where he practiced law and farmed. In 1883 Barrow moved to Little Rock. He served in the Arkansas House of Representatives, 1889-1900. He died in Little Rock on November 23, 1919, and is buried in Oakland Cemetery. John Barrow Road in Little Rock was named for him.
