New York Sept 26<sup>th</sup> 1841

My dear Governor: Mr Christie made a strong point in being appointed financial agent for our state in Europe. He desires the appointment to add Wright, and Conner, to his own statements in places on the Continent when he is not acquainted. As the place involves no duties and no pay I told him that I would talk with you about it and request you to make the appointment. I see what his purpose is and judge that it may do some good. Let the Commission be worded that he only acts subject to your further order and it will leave him the

dignity - and the privilege of  
saying something good of us he  
can. All he wants is for  
it effect.

The Gt Smith indent has not  
come up yet and it now  
looks as if it would not come  
up - I told Sickles that  
if all other hooks failed I  
would divide the thing with  
them as it would be ruinous  
to have a default now on any  
of the bonds - Sickles has  
agreed to it but can't hear  
from Lewis -

Our affairs seem to be in  
a very hopeful condition.

Am going to Oberlin tomorrow  
& will be in Arkansas with my  
English menagerie about the  
15<sup>th</sup> inst.
