Dear Sir

In the case of George H. Buel's account against the State if you will fill up the necessary Blank and help me to get it through we can get our half, so if we make the day you and me will divide you have the account fix up the Blank and send me word immediately the proof can be made, and we had better make \$75 when we can - write to me what kind a man Edward Wheeler is - I sent him word to get those papers supposing him to be all right - but for you we clerk, send them up and I will fix Blanks & Proof, and we will - keep this understanding and in those cases I will appear as attorney and divide you - all ok.
