BE IT KNOWN, that, on this *fifth* day of *June*  
in the year one thousand eight hundred and *forty* at the request of  
*The Bank of the State of Arkansas.*

*Holder* of the original *Note* whereof  
a true copy is on the reverse hereof written, *I John Hunt,*  
a NOTARY PUBLIC, in and for the County of *Pulaski* State of Arkansas,  
aforesaid, duly commissioned and sworn,

*Presented said Note at the*  
*Comptroller of said Bank in Little Rock where the same*  
*was made payable and demanded Payment thereof,*  
*And was advised by the Teller that there was*  
*no funds in Bank to meet said Note*

WHEREUPON, I, the said Notary, at the request aforesaid, did protest, and, by these  
presents, do publicly and solemnly protest, as well against the drawer or maker of  
the said *Note* as against all others whom it doth or may concern,  
for all exchange, re-exchange, damages, costs, charges, and interests, suffered or to be  
suffered for want of *Payment* of the said *Note*.
