Know All Men by these Presents that we William
 R Hallford as Principal And A. H. Newmon
 And W^m Turner as Securites are tied And firmly
 bound unto the State of Arkansas in the Sum of one
 Thousand Dollars Lawful money of the United States
 To be levied on our Respective goods And Chattels
 Lands And tenements Given under our hands
 And seals this 12th day of May AD 1845

The Condition of the above obligation is
 such that whereas the said William R Hallford was
 duly elected And Commissioned Sheriff And
 Enofficio Assessor And Collector of the County
 of Perry Now of the said William R Hallford as
 Sheriff as aforesaid shall Receipt for the Tax Book
 of Perry County for the year AD 1845 And collect
 the Taxes Assessed on said Book as the Statute
 in such Cases made and provides And pay
 the same over to the County Treasurer And the
 Auditor of Public Accounts of the State of
 Arkansas in due time as the Law directs

Then this obligation to be void Otherwise
 remain in fulforce And virtue Day And year
 first above written
