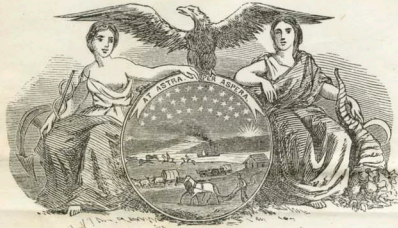

To His Excellency, The Governor of the State of Arkansas

WHEREAS, it appears by Indictment in the District Court in and for County of Linn and State of Kansas 4th Judicial District Fall term.

duly authenticated, in accordance with the Laws of this State, that A. A. Rogers stand charged with the crime of selling liquor without license committed in the county of Linn in said State; and it has been represented to me that he has fled from justice of this State, and may have taken refuge in the State of Arkansas

NOW, THEREFORE, pursuant to the provisions of the Constitution and Laws of the United States in such case made and provided, I do hereby require that the said A. A. Rogers be apprehended and delivered to Edward R. Smith who is hereby authorized to receive and convey him to the State of Kansas, there to be dealt with according to law.

IN TESTIMONY WHEREOF, I have hereunto set my Hand and caused to be affixed the GREAT SEAL of the State, at the City of Topeka, this 26th day of July, in the year of our Lord one, thous. and eight hundred and sixty-seven, the 29th year of the State, and of the Independence of the United States the 92nd
