Biographical/Historical Note

Charles B. Johnson was born September 10, 1819, in Hartford, Connecticut. He later emigrated to Arkansas where he owned a mercantile business in Fort Smith with his brother, William R. Johnson. After the death of his brother in 1847, Charles continued the business with his brother-in-law, Marshal Grimes. He married Margaret A. Rector, the youngest daughter of Colonel Wharton Rector of Crawford County, in 1848, and had several children.

Johnson was stationed at Fort Smith with the 51st Arkansas Militia on January 14, 1861. He was then sent to Sherman, Texas, by Major Thomas Lanigan as Commissioner Agent for the First Army Corps of the Trans-Mississippi Department of the Confederate States of America, where he served the rest of the war. He returned to Fort Smith in 1869, but was soon taken ill. He never recovered from the illness and died January, 1870.
