TO THE MARSHAL OF THE WESTERN DISTRICT OF ARKANSAS—GREETING:

WHEREAS, At the District Court of the United States of America, for the Western District of Arkansas, at the Aug term thereof, begun and holden in Fort Smith, within and for the District aforesaid, on the 7 day of Oct A. D. 1894 the Grand Jurors in and for said District empaneled, brought into the said Court a true bill of indictment against

Daniel Tilden

for

R.S.D.

in the Indian Country, against the peace and dignity of the United States, as by the said indictment, now remaining on file and of record in said Court, will more fully appear; to which indictment said

Daniel Tilden

has not yet appeared

or pleaded.

Now, therefore, you are hereby commanded, as you have heretofore been, in the name of the President of the United States of America, to apprehend said Daniel Tilden and him to detain and bring before the said Court at the United States Court-room in Fort Smith, in said District, at the Fourth Term thereof, to be held on the Fourth day of Forth A. D. 1894 to answer said indictment.
