TO THE MARSHAL OF THE WESTERN DISTRICT OF ARKANSAS—GREETING:

WHEREAS, At the District Court of the United States of America, for the Western District of Arkansas, at the Aug term thereof, begun and holden in Fort Smith, within and for the District aforesaid, on the 22 day of Oct A. D. 1894 the Grand Jurors in and for said District empaneled, brought into the said Court a true bill of indictment against

James Lingo

for

Taking Letters

in the Indian Country, against the peace and dignity of the United States, as by the said indictment, now remaining on file and of record in said Court, will more fully appear; to which indictment said

James Lingo has not yet appeared or pleaded.

Now, therefore, you are hereby commanded, as you have heretofore been, in the name of the President of the United States of America, to apprehend said James Lingo and him to detain and bring before the said Court at the United States Court-room in Fort Smith, in said District, at the Mar Term thereof, to be held on the 5 day of Nov A. D. 1894 to answer said indictment.

IN TESTIMONY WHEREOF, the Honorable ISAAC C. PARKER, Judge of the District Court of the United States for the Western District of Arkansas, has caused the seal of said Court to be hereunto affixed this 22 day of Oct A. D. 1894 and in the 119 year of our Independence.
