## **Biographical Note**

Benjamin Kellogg was born circa 1797 in Massachusetts. After completing his blacksmith apprenticeship, he moved to Arkansas in 1819, and set up a smithy shop. He is credited for making a broadaxe that was used to hew logs for one of the first log homes in Little Rock, built for H.B. Chandler. Kellogg died July 11, 1848.
