James Kilgour was a slave owner that lived in Rapides Parish, Territory of Orleans, at the beginning of the nineteenth century.

Scope and Contents

This sworn deposition before Judge Richard Claiborne, Parish of Rapides, Territory of Orleans, by James Kilgour concerns a stolen slave by the name of Sam. Kilgour was informing the court that a man by the name of Moses Harris, alias Hamilton, stole Sam the season before.
