Biographical/Historical Note

Charles Fenton Mercer Noland was born in Aldie, Virginia, on August 23, 1810, the fourth of the five children of William and Catherine (Callender) Noland. In 1925, Fent Noland came to Batesville, Independence County, Arkansas, where he read law under James Woodson Bates. He wrote for the New York "Spirit of the Times," a leading sports and humor newspaper. His fictional character "Pete Whetstone" gave him notoriety at the national level.

Scope and Contents

This collection contains newsclippings published in 1857. The articles discuss early politics and commerce in Arkansas Territory, including the men who held the first political offices, and the bustling riverport town of Batesville.
