Historical Note

The Arkansas Claims Commission's primary function is the hearing and adjudication of claims against the state of Arkansas, its agencies, and its institutions. Established by the 1874 Arkansas Constitution, it serves as a fact-finding body for the General Assembly. The Commission hears and determines claims for property damage, personal injury, refunds, and breach of contract.

Charles Standish Collins was a Little Rock, Arkansas, attorney in the late 1800s. He was a partner in the law firm "Collins and Balch" on Markham Street.

Scope and Contents

This collection contains seventy-nine judgments for claims against the State of Arkansas (including militia judgments), a letter from Charles Collins concerning a case, and an agreement regarding a payment from an estate.
