Biographical/Historical Note

Alexander Copeland Millar (1861- 1940) was born May 17, 1861, in McKeesport, Pennsylvania, to William John Millar and Ellen Caven. In 1867, the Millar family moved to Missouri. In 1885, Alexander Millar graduated Central College, a Methodist affiliated school, in Fayette, Missouri and also earned a M.A. there as well. Millar began teaching after college and first taught at the Brookfield Academy in Missouri.. In 1887, he became president of Central Collegiate Institute in Altus, Arkansas, where he played a major role in changing the school's name to Hendrix College and moving it to Conway in 1890. Millar was ordained a minister in the Methodist Episcopal Church, South in 1888. Millar served in several church administrative positions, including presiding elder of the Little Rock District. Millar later helped organize the Arkansas Anti-Saloon League. Millar died November 9, 1940, in Little Rock.
